

## Civil engineering department facilities

The Faculty of Engineering and its laboratories and classrooms occupy five buildings on UT main campus, namely: first and second floors in building 8 are assigned for offices of the faculty dean, heads of departments, staff members, meeting rooms, admirative staff, and printing facilities. Buildings 11 and 12 are assigned for laboratories, workshops, and computer facilities. Buildings 4 and 6 are assigned for classrooms. (*Building 4 is shared with the Faculty of Computer Science and Information Technology*)

The Civil Engineering (CE) department has laboratories that include devices and equipment used to conduct experimental and tests related to different courses and undergraduate projects of students, as well as research by faculty members.

### A. Offices, Classrooms and Laboratories

#### A.1 Offices: Administrative, Faculty, and Teaching Assistant Offices

The CE departmental occupies a part of two floors in the Faculty of Engineering building, Building 8, on the UT main campus. There are 10 faculty and assistant offices, two staff offices, two meeting rooms, and a storage room. CE regular department meetings are held in a meeting room within the chairmanship area, room 01-08-1-35. During COVID19 Pandemic, all the department meetings are held electronically via UT-Blackboard facility. The room is equipped with 18 seats and round table, the room is equipped with data-show and audio facilities. The room is 10m × 5m and is sometimes used for conducting graduation SDP meetings and SDP defense presentations and examinations. The office of the CE Department Chairman, 01-08-1-01, is located on the first floor of Building 8 on UT main campus. The room is 5m × 4m. Offices of faculty members are located on the first and second floors of the building. Faculty members' offices are reasonably spacious and comfortable enough to fulfill professional needs duties and responsibilities. All offices are air-conditioned and many of them have access to natural day light. Each faculty member has a desktop computer with basic software installed. Specialized software tools are installed upon request. Each faculty member has a printer and scanner in their office and has full access to the internet and the

university intranet. High-quality photocopy machines are available for faculty members in the copy machines room.

## **A.2 Classrooms**

The Faculty of Engineering provides teaching classrooms. Classrooms are adequately equipped with chairs and desks, instructor desks, data show, and a white board.

There are 18 classrooms available, each of 30 student capacity. In addition, there are four big classrooms of 70 student capacity and different studios for engineering drawing courses. Scheduling of classrooms in these buildings is the responsibility of the University. Most of these classrooms and studios have access to natural day light and all of them are air-conditioned.
